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1. Introduction

1.1. To have an agreed list of abbreviations that can be used when completing documents such as patient report forms.

2. Responsibility

2.1. All Hart First Response volunteers.

3. Process

- 3.1. In order to make the completion of patient report forms and other documents quick and easy it is agreed that, where appropriate, abbreviations may be used in place of full phrases.
- 3.2. All abbreviations to be used must be approved by the Executive Committee.
- 3.3. All approved abbreviations are listed in section 4 "Approved Abbreviations".
- 3.4. The Approved Abbreviation list can be updated as necessary but all superseding lists must be replaced immediately.
- 3.5. A copy of the Approved Abbreviation list will be available on events, and will be located in the vehicle folder.
- 3.6. Any abbreviation can only be used in place of the phrase as specified on the Approved Abbreviation list.
- 3.7. No other abbreviations other than those on the abbreviation list may be used at any time.
- 3.8. It is particularly important that any abbreviation used is written clearly and legibly in the format it appears on the Approved Abbreviation List. The use of an abbreviation is not an excuse for poor or incomplete documentation.
- 3.9. Use of abbreviations should always be kept to a minimum. It is important that abbreviations are not used to such an extent that the meaning of the documentation becomes impossible to decipher.
- 3.10. The appendix (section 5) includes abbreviations previously used in HFR paperwork that are NOT approved and should not be used in future. They merely represent a translation to enable understanding of previous paperwork.
